

# Elisabeth's Epistle



Happy new year! The beginning of Advent marks the beginning of the church's new liturgical year. So this December 1, when we celebrate the first Sunday of Advent, we also start Year A of our church calendar. And, as it happens, the readings for Advent 1 are always rather apocalyptic; that is, they focus not on the coming of the baby Jesus at Christmas, but on Jesus' second coming. So we hear things like: Be ready! Be prepared! The Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour! This can be quite startling for those of us giddily humming along to Christmas carols.

What do we make of this message from Jesus to keep alert? What do we do with the strangeness of John the Baptist out there in the wilderness telling us to prepare the way? Is it only the Christ child we wait for, or are we also waiting for Christ's coming again in glory, as we say in the Nicene Creed? I keep a Christmas card in my office with a quote by Meister Eckhart that reads, "We are all meant to be mothers of God, for God is always needing to be born." The world aches for news of our savior. Advent is a holy time of preparation and longing. It is a time when it is OK to be out of sync with the world around us, a time when our preparation may involve making room for feelings of grief and loss. After all, we wait not just for a baby, but for the return of our incarnate God who is making all things new. You are welcome at St. Alban's this season, whether you wait in joy, or in grief, in hope, or in expectation.
