We were reminded by Psalms 23 and 100 that *God* is our Good Shepherd and "we are his people and the sheep of his pasture."

THE WAY OF LOVE Practices for Jesus-Centered Life

During October and November, you're invited to journey with St. Alban's as we explore The Way of Love, a set of seven spiritual practices to guide us on the road of discipleship. Presiding Bishop Michael Curry has invited all Episcopalians to reflect on these spiritual practices and how they might help each of us in building a "rule of life." Although a "rule of life" has long been associated with monastic communities, at its core it is simply a way of identifying the patterns and rhythms that help us faithfully follow Christ, whatever our household structure or vocation may be. We'll be looking at each of the seven practices of The Way of Love, with the goal of figuring out individually how to incorporate them into our lives in sustainable ways that help us grow in faith.

What are the seven spiritual practices in The Way of Love?



- Turn: Pause, listen, and choose to follow Jesus
- **Learn:** Reflect on Scripture each day, especially on Jesus' life and teachings
- **Pray:** Dwell intentionally with God daily
- **Worship:** Gather in community weekly to thank, praise, and dwell with God
- Bless: Share faith and unselfishly give and serve
- Go: Cross boundaries, listen deeply, and live like Jesus
- **Rest:** Receive the gift of God's grace, peace, and restoration

How will we explore *The Way of Love* the next two months at St. Alban's? Sermons over the next two months will feature the practices of *The Way of Love*. Look in the Parish Hall for written materials about The Way of Love to help guide your own reflections on how you incorporate these practices into your own life.
