


Sunday School classrooms and business office. Our church was packed with the energy that only youth can exude.

outdoor activities, a special breakfast on Sunday morning with church members and performing for the 11:00 AM Holy Eucharist.

# Holy Week

The truth is there is no way around Holy Week. There is no way to skip the pain of Holy Week. There is no shortcut to Easter. We are called to make the journey from Palm Sunday to Monday—Tuesday—Wednesday—Maundy Thursday—Good Friday—Holy Saturday Morning—The Great Vigil of Easter—to Easter Sunday. We are called to walk the way of the cross with Jesus—just as Jesus walks the way of the cross with us.

We started the journey on Ash Wednesday and have been living into Lent by our special Lenten practices that may become lifetime practices. Now we are approaching the holiest of weeks—the week that Jesus arrived in Jerusalem on the back of a donkey and was greeted with Hosannas. This is celebrated at the Eucharist on Palm Sunday and ends with the discovery of the empty tomb at the celebrations of the Resurrection Eucharist on Easter Sunday. Let us journey through Holy Week as a community of pilgrims.



#### Deacon Discernment



#### My Timeline from Discernment to Ordination as a Deacon

- **October 2006**—A **Day on the Diaconate** is designed for those exploring a call to the diaconate. *This is the first step in examining a call to the diaconate.*
- **January 29, 2007**—**Formation of discernment committee**. After meeting with my rector, Rev. Ann Whitaker, she obtained permission from Bishop Gray to form a discernment committee, a committee of nine persons who meet nine times. *If no approval from the Bishop the process would end here.*
- **August 31, 2007**—**Meeting with Bishop Gray.** Bishop Gray encourages me to let the process work and to enter it prayerfully. *If the Bishop does not consent process ends here.*
- December 27, 2007—Discernment Committee Report sent to St. Alban's Vestry. If the vestry does not approve the report the process ends here.

- January 2008—St. Alban's Vestry Approves Discernment Committee Report.
- **June 2008—Diocesan Committee Meeting.** Committee meets with Theo and me separately. *If the committee does not consent process ends here.*
- March 2008—Meeting with Bishop Gray. If the Bishop does not consent process ends here.
- **April 28, 2008—Psychological Examination**. If psychological exam raises questions process ends here.
- **August 13, 2008**—**Admitted as Postulant.** Aspirant---from application process until admitted to school. Postulant---school until final recommendation to Bishop. *If final recommendation was not given process ends here.*
- **September 5, 2008—Deacon School Begins.** Friday: 6:00-8:30 Spiritual Formation. Saturday: 8:30-4:00 Class.

**December 2010—Deacon School Ends** 

January 15, 2011—Ordination to Diaconate. The end result of the process. Goal reached.

The process to become a deacon is a long one but it works. Had I not had patience at the beginning, I certainly did by the end. My goal to become ordained as a deacon has been reached, but the work has just begun.

At the 2013 Annual Council, Bishop Duncan Gray announced his plans to retire. His decision set in motion the process for the election of the 10<sup>th</sup> Bishop of Mississippi. After a year of prayerful discernment and diligent work, the slate of candidates was announced:

- The Rev. Dr. Michael Battle, St. Titus Episcopal Church, Durham, NC
- The Rev. Marian Dulaney Fortner, Trinity Episcopal Church, Hattiesburg, MS
- The Rev. Dr. R. Stan Runnels, St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Kansas City, MO
- The Very Rev. Brian Seage, St. Columb's Episcopal Church, Ridgeland, MS
