





PBillie's Corner

LENT 2017

Lent 2017 is almost over. Some of us have stayed with our Lenten disciplines that we initiated on Ash Wednesday. Others of us have not! The journey through the season of Lent is a reflection of our journey through life—sometimes our plans work out and sometimes they don't. Nothing is wasted. God meets us where we are.

The purpose of this letter is not to make anyone feel guilty if your intentions have not become your realities. This letter is intended for everyone, no matter where you find yourself on the Lenten journey. I am here to say that there is more Lent ahead—more opportunities to encounter God's love, mercy and forgiveness as we make our way through the final weeks of Lent and into Holy Week—through the cross that leads to resurrection—from death to life.

My Lenten practice is the same as my morning practice every day of the year. I start my day with the *daily offering* from the *Brothers of Saint John the Evangelist*, an Episcopal monastic community in Massachusetts. First thing each morning, I reach for my cell phone and open my email to read the daily meditation from SSJE. This low-tech, old gray-haired lady begins each day accessing the mysterious power of the internet by way of my cell phone. For those of you who are computer savvy and comfortable with technology, my amazement might sound ridiculous. But, not for anyone who lets technology get the best of you—you are among those who understand that my phone does things that were "science fiction" when I was a child. Now, as we live into the age of technology, I can read the daily meditations on my cell phone and even listen to the Brothers speak by way of *YouTube*. Who'd of thought it!

Most importantly, whether the Lenten resources you rely on are high tech or low tech, do not get discouraged if you fail to complete all that you had planned. There is always tomorrow—there is always HOLY WEEK.

- On *Palm/Passion Sunday*, we can follow Jesus as he parades into Jerusalem, we can wave palms and sing "Hosanna in the highest."
- On *Maundy Thursday*, we can surrender to Jesus and allow him to wash our feet, and then feed us the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation—we can hear Jesus tell us to love one another as he has loved us.
- On *Good Friday*, we can follow Jesus to his crucifixion, stay with him, suffer with him, and die with him; we can hear Jesus say, "It is finished."
- At the *Great Vigil of Easter*, we can follow the Paschal Candle into the darkness of the tomb and watch as the darkness of death is transformed into the light of life—we can sing out *Alleluia* for the first time since Ash Wednesday.
- On *Easter Morning*, we can go to the tomb, thinking that the stone will be a problem to roll away from the entrance, only to discover that Jesus could not be contained in a sealed tomb—Jesus has risen out of death and into life and taken us with him into the assurance of eternal life.

Alleluia, Christ is risen. The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Easter is almost here. When the May *Albanac* comes out, Easter Day will have been celebrated and the *Great Fifty Days of Easter* will have begun (*Great Fifty Days* is from Easter Eve until *The Feast of Pentecost*).

Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice for us, not because we deserve it, but because it is always His property to have mercy. Grace and mercy—unmerited favor and generosity—are gifts our Savior gives us. Are we willing to receive them? The gifts are ours for the asking. We just need to open our hearts to His grace and truth.

The Confession of Sin is omitted during the Great Fifty Days because Jesus died for our sins. We are free to bask in His love, forgiveness, grace and mercy. The choice is ours until the moment we draw our last breath on earth. During the Confession of Sin, we pray standing because Jesus has knelt for us. The Alleluias and the Confession of Sin return to the Holy Eucharist when the Great Fifty Days ends and The Feast of Pentecost begins.

If Jesus is not our Number One Priority, we pray that we will make the changes necessary to make *Him* so. By becoming His disciples, we are to be His hands, feet, and voice to the world—spreading the Good News to all ends of the earth. Perhaps we are reluctant to become disciples because we don't feel worthy. But, by virtue of baptism, we are *Disciples of Christ*. The disciples of Jesus made mistakes and we will as well. But, as we grow in faith, we will continue to move forward through God's saving grace. 'For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God." (Ephesians 2:8)

When we participate in the Eucharist we are encouraged to *become what we receive*—leading others to accept Christ as their savior. "Take my life and let it be, Consecrated, Lord, to Thee."
