



The season of Advent is one of those times when the Church seems so out of step with the world. While the advertising industry promotes fighting the crowds in stores to get the best bargains, the Church is inviting us to slow down and ponder the wonder of the coming birth of Immanuel, *God with us.* While sounds of "Here Comes Santa Claus" are amplified into businesses, the Church sings "Come, thou long expected Jesus, born to set thy people free . . ." While holiday magazines feature houses decorated with glitz and glamour, the Church lights purple and pink candles that are nestled in a wreath of simple greenery. While holiday recipes tempt us with rich cuisine presented on ornate bedecked tables, the Church prepares the feast of Bread and Wine assembled atop an altar draped with a plain and fair linen.

All of the above describes the Advent that I anticipate. I long for the quiet—I treasure the short days and long nights—I want to hear the Advent hymns that are sung for only four brief weeks before Christmas—I yearn for time to prepare for the birthing of the Infant Jesus. 
