

#### Come In, Be Still, Light a Candle, Say a Prayer, Go in Peace.

Another calendar year has ended. A fresh year lies ahead—a new beginning. I hesitate to make New Year's Resolutions. My past experience has taught me that I enthusiastically make all kinds of promises to myself and quickly find reasons not to keep them. So what I am proposing is not a New Year's Resolution because it doesn't begin with me. It begins with God's invitation to all of us to give ourselves time to "be still and know that I am God."



While I was at *The Monastery of Saint John the Evangelist*, I noticed a sign that was placed on the sidewalk outside the main entrance of the church. The sign was an invitation to *Come In, Be Still, Light a Candle, Say a Prayer, Go in Peace.* I noticed people coming into the church for a brief pause in their day—a quick break from the demands of their lives.

Something about the simplicity of the Brothers' invitation has stayed with me. How could Saint Alban's Church offer such an invitation? We are not located on a busy urban thoroughfare—we are in the country. Warrior's Trail does not have a sidewalk. If we had such a sign would anyone stop? How could we adapt a city oriented ministry to our country setting?

One way would be to rely on the practice of "praying alone, together." We as a community could simply pause at some point in our day and **figuratively** enter Saint Alban's sanctuary—*Come In, Be Still, Light a Candle, Say a Prayer, Go in Peace.* What would such a simple prayer practice do for us and to us?

"Praying alone, together" is another way of communal prayer—another way to join together as the Body of Christ in an act of worship. Our prayers are always a response to God—we are always answering God's invitation to a more intimate relationship. What if everyone doesn't participate in this prayer practice? The amazing thing about God's grace is that it doesn't have particular stipulations. It is free to all. Prayer has a trickle down quality. The prayers of a few can influence many.

During the year 2014, I am establishing a *First Wednesday Quiet Day* at Saint Alban's. A *Quiet Day* once a month is another way to incorporate this prayer practice into our community and to invite others to *"Come to the Country—Come to Saint Alban's Church."* 

On the first Wednesday of each month, the church will be open from 7:00 AM — 7:00 PM. Morning Prayer, Noon Prayer, Evening Prayer, the Healing Service and Eucharist will be the formal times of prayer throughout the day. The remaining time will offer the invitation to *Come In, Be Still, Light a Candle, Say a Prayer, Go in Peace.* 

Let us continue to expand our horizons in 2014. Let us continue to say "Yes" to God's invitation to love us.

### The Village of Saint Alban

The village of St. Alban's is located throughout Warren and Hinds counties and the *spirit* of the village resonates in the hearts of those who worship in the parish of St. Alban's Church.

St. Alban's parishioners continually meet the needs of those who request help with utility bills, school lunches, school uniforms, rent, and cap and gown fees. During 2013, these fantastic parishioners provided assistance on numerous occasions: utility bills 33 times; rent assistance 6 times; gift cards 18 times; cap & gown fees 4 times; and school lunches for 8 children. In addition, they donated \$1,400 to *Haven House Battered Women's Shelter* to help after some of their funding was cut off.

The ECW provided gifts for a mother with three children. They bought pants, shirts, underwear, shoes and a toy for each child. There were over 30 packages on Sunday morning in the Parish House. It was enough to make Saint Nicholas blush! After church, Theo and I went to Kroger's and bought groceries for this family and delivered the gifts. The mother was speechless and her sister and brother wanted to know the source of the gifts. We told them St. Alban's Episcopal Church and that the ECW was the source of the barrage of Christmas presents. The mother was so elated she decided to put up her Christmas tree because she was going to "have Christmas" after all.

The *Lasagna Garden* at the Warren County Juvenile Detention Center provided students with the opportunity to plant, water, nourish and pick cabbage, cauliflower and broccoli. The jail cook then prepared a meal for them. I cannot thank you enough for donating the materials so that this learning experience could be given to students who had never gardened before.

St. Alban's is a participant in the Charity Tracker System. Persons needing assistance are asked to fill out a form with name, address, social security number and type of assistance needed. Photo identification must be attached to the bill. The name and address with the last four of the social security number are entered into the Warren County Charity Tracker database. This allows a reduction in duplication of services with payment being made by different agencies or churches.

I ask for your continued support and prayers in 2014. Wishing all of you a happy and most blessed New Year!!!!
