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

Genevieve Walker, Kerri Williams, Rev. Billie Abraham, Joey Gerache and Ben Porter



Each summer my family and I gather at the beach for a vacation. I arrive a couple of days early to have some time to simply sit still under the shade of an umbrella and rest. I always marvel at the wideness of the horizon and the vastness of the sky and water—and I always realize how I have allowed my perspective of daily life to narrow down on a particular issue until I am entirely focused an isolated incident.

So what to do about such a dilemma?!! I think the answer is to take time to remember the experience of looking out at the turquoise water and the blue sky and the vast horizon—to recall the sound of the waves lapping the shoreline and to feel the warmth of the sun—and to recall that God took chaos and created order. Within the chaos of my endless to-do lists, God's vastness exists. The memory of the beach has the power to put the chores of daily life into proper perspective. I can return to the beach by visualizing the expanse of the water and sky—I can depart from a narrow perspective by returning to the awareness of the grand scale of God's creation.

This year I did not leave the beach in Florida—I brought it back with me. When I recognize that I am getting mired in daily predicaments, I return to the sweeping horizon of water and sky to get a broader view. It is always accessible. All I have to do is pause and recall— *And God saw that it was good.*

The Road to Ordination



The final year of Deacon School started on September 10, 2010. Over the four year course, I was required to write an Ember letter four times a year to Bishop Gray. In ancient times, Ember days occurred four times a year: between the 3rd and 4th Sundays in Advent, between the 1st and 2nd Sundays in Lent, between Pentecost and Trinity Sunday and the week beginning on the Sunday after Holy Cross Day. Ember days were designated for special prayers and fasting and were considered especially suitable for the ordination of clergy. My Ember letters to Bishop Gray included a progress report, my reactions to deacon school, the books I read and an update on my family.

Formation was taught by Gay Yerger. The focus was on the Baptismal Covenant and the Ordination of the Deacon. We reviewed and read these services in the *Book of Common Prayer* in preparation for ordination.

Homiletics was taught by Rev. Jennifer Deaton. Required texts were *The Preaching Life* and *Preaching*. During this course, I learned the history and theology as well as history and place of preaching in the liturgy. I studied sermon elements, writing techniques and resources used in preparing sermons.

My preaching assignment was Proper 24 Year C and included answers to the following questions:

- What is preaching and how is it related to the larger purposes of God?
- How is preaching related to Scripture? Liturgy? Community of faith? Pastoral work? Service?
- What is the role of the Holy Spirit in preaching?
- How does the unique calling and ministry of the diaconate shape the purpose and content of preaching?

My classmates and I were presented reflection questions to answer on each other's sermon. The questions included:

- What was the focus of the sermon?
- What helped you to hear the preacher's message?
- What would have helped you hear the message better?
- How will this sermon make a difference to you?

Liturgics was taught by Rev. Greg Proctor. Required texts were *Deacons in the Liturgy* and *Many Servants.* I was assigned to write a set of *Prayers of the People* and a customary for my intern church, Church of the Creator, and my home church, St. Alban's. A customary is an order of service written down with instructions for priest, and congregation starting with the procession and the Crucifer and ending with the procession and dismissal by the deacon.

My classmates and I designed our ordination service under Rev. Proctor's direction. We selected the litanist, the readers, hymns and preachers for the service. All four of us had to agree on each selection. Once the service was complete it was sent to the Bishop Gray for final approval. After approval from the bishop it was sent to the printers and we were given the okay to mail invitations to our ordination. I received instructions on how to prepare a letter of agreement to be submitted to the vestry for approval and then to the bishop for final approval. Ordination was January 15, 2011, at St. Andrew's Cathedral. This was the moment I had been anticipating for three years. It was the culmination of a lot of hard work, prayer, and perseverance.
