St. Alban's Community Bids Farewell


On April 28, 2019, Rev. Billie preached her final sermon before retiring to her new home in Albuquerque, New Mexico. The church was filled to capacity while the organist, Shirlene Gill, and St. Alban's choir filled the Holy Space with the sound of music. There were tears of joy and sorrow as church members, family and friends came to celebrate Rev. Billie's last Sunday at her beloved "Church in the Country."

Prior to Billie's arrival in 2008, twenty-five priests had served St. Alban's Church. The longest serving priest was Rev. Valentine Sessions who was rector from 1919 – 1944. The second longest priests to serve were Rev. James Angel Fox (1870—1881) and Rev. Billie Abraham (2008— 2019). Both served the St. Alban's community for approximately 11 years.

St. Alban's-A Place in Time

St. Alban's Church Holds Festive Gala— 1880

On April, 19, 1880, a delegation of ladies from St. Alban's Church visited the *Vicksburg Daily Commercial* to place a publicity notice for a fundraising gala to take place in Bovina on Thursday, April 22. All proceeds would be donated to the church. Excitement was in the air! The railroad authorities even offered to let "festive fellows for Bovina go at half rate for this occasion." A special reporter was sent to cover the story and subsequently wrote a delightful rendition of all that took place in Bovina that night and well into the wee hours of the morning—dancing under the stars and the light of the silvery moon.

"The Festival at Bovina for the Benefit of Their Episcopal Church" Vicksburg Daily Commercial, April 23, 1880

"Your reporter attended a magnificent festival at Bovina last night, at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Henry M. Goff, for the benefit of the Episcopal Church at that site.

"In company with not less than sixty young ladies and gentlemen of the Hill City, we arrived at Bovina on a special train, under the charge and management of the good and clever Mr. J. B. Brown. The night was beautiful, the moon now and then appearing through the floating clouds. The house of Mr. Goff's is situated about one hundred yards from the railroad, and we found it brilliantly illuminated without and within, and a great crowd of ladies and gentlemen from the neighborhood assembled, where we arrived at nine p.m. The band of music had gone out with us,



and the *Feast of Terpsichore* [goddess of dancing] commenced not long after. To say the festival was a splendid occasion would be doing simple justice to the getter-up and managers of this affair. Every one seemed full of gayety and humor. '*All went merry as a marriage bell and eyes looked love to eyes that spake again.*' And when the hour came that we should part, at three a.m., delicious morning hour, wearyful expressed themselves as to say, '*I am delighted with my night's entertainment.*'

"The managers of the festival were Mrs. J. V. Bell, Mrs. James I. Fox [Adeline Hebron Fox], and Mrs. H. M. Goff, kindly assisted by Mrs. J. S. Morris, Mrs. H. P. Noland and Mrs. Henry Bolls.

"Miss Ellie Hebron officiated as a flower girl, and her witching manner found her many customers, and few that night were seen without a superb boutonniere.

"The hall for dancing was large and spacious and waxed and decked with garlands of flowers and ivy for the occasion. A large gallery afforded all a place of promenade where the real lover and the amateur flirt could whisper those "soft nothings" so important to the moment. The floor managers were Messrs. J. V. Bell and James I. Fox.

"The refreshments consisted of ice cream, sherbet, strawberries, cakes, coffee etc. A beautiful pyramidal bouquet was raffled by Mrs. J. I. Fox [Adeline Hebron Fox] and won by Mr. T. R. Foster of this city. Lucky number, 44.

"The proceeds of the entertainment were one-hundred and six dollars. Much praises are due the managers for the great success of their festival, and all the guests will remember the enjoyable night at Bovina on the twenty-second of April 1880.

"Your reporter had the pleasure of receiving a large and fragrant bouquet for the editor of the *Commercial* from the hands of Mrs. J. V. Bell. We are sure that those who attended the festival from Vicksburg will join in the assertion that nothing was lacking to afford enjoyment, and to bid the parting guests a happy memory of the affable hosts and pleasant assemblage."



Thanks to Sue B. Moore, researcher from Longview, Texas, for sharing this delightful 1880 newspaper clipping with the St. Alban's community. The Goff house was located within walking distance to the train station. H. M. Goff and others named in the article are buried in St. Alban's Cemetery. One can only envision the exciting social event that took place that moonlight night in the historic Bovina community.

Other than being informative, the article serves as a reminder that food, entertainment and hospitality are in the DNA of the St. Alban's community.
