Dinner on the Grounds – Sunday, October 27th




1940s photograph of *Dinner on the Grounds* at St. Alban's

On September 3, the students in the Warren County detention center planted broccoli, cauliflower, cabbage and tomato plants; beets and mustard green seeds in their "Lasagna Garden." They watered the garden daily. Three weeks later, the result is nothing less than phenomenal!

This is the first time for many of the students to plant something and watch it grow. They will reap the benefits of your (St. Alban's) generosity when the produce is picked and prepared by the jail cooks for lunch or dinner. From seed—to plant—to produce—to table is a concept the students can now understand because they have participated in the process and not just read about it in a book.
