


#### **Blessing Macy Weaver**

#### **Lenten Soup Suppers**





#### Elisabeth's Epistle



On March 21-22, the second annual Small Church Conference was held at Grace Episcopal Church in Canton. As part of the organizing team, I was thrilled at our turn out-over 60 leaders from over 25 congregations around the state participated. A wide range of churches were represented, from those like St. Alban's that have a full-time rector to much smaller churches who might only have a supply priest once a month. Senior Warden Sharon Hanks and Vestry Member Harvey Smith participated in the conference, as well as Carolyn Gent Burton, who officiated morning prayer and helped lead a workshop on stewardship of volunteers. My take-aways from the conference included the following: 1) our small churches have immense talent sitting in the pews, from our lay worship leaders and musicians, to the volunteers who lead Sunday school and organize outreach; 2) the small church of the future (and in many ways the present) is going to be lay-led and clergy-supported; 3) our liturgical tradition has many beautiful options for services, including morning prayer, that can be led by lay leaders; and 4) we're all going to need to get comfortable with innovation and change as we move into the future, but it's all going to be alright as long as we remember that God is with us.


