Holy Baptism

January 7 was an exciting Sunday for St. Alban's! On this Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord, when we remember Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River, we had a baptism at each service. At the 8:30 AM service, Charlie Montague was baptized, and at the 11:00 AM service, Peyton Bryan was baptized. Many Episcopalians are accustomed to baptizing infants and young children. But the historic model for baptism is the baptism of adults, something implicitly recognized in the 1979 prayerbook when "Adults and Older Children" was listed first in the service of Holy Baptism. Infant baptism has a place in our tradition, with its emphasis on God's grace and our adoption into the family of God. But adult baptism draws our attention to other aspects of baptism: to repentance, cleansing from sin, and our continuing formation as disciples of Jesus. We are so grateful for both Charlie and Peyton sharing their baptisms with us and inspiring us to remember our own baptisms and calling.

Elisabeth's Epistle

What makes a church vital? This is the month when my mind often turns to this question, as I compile statistics for our annual parochial report. Is vitality measured by the number of people who attend church every Sunday? Is it measured by the amount of money we collected last year? Maybe it's measured in the number of baptisms? These are all numbers we report on a yearly basis, and don't get me wrong, they are important. But most years, they aren't particularly impressive. We are, after all, a small church. There's nothing wrong with being small. There are plenty of small churches brimming with vitality, the kind of places that make a difference in their communities.

So if it's not those surface statistics, maybe vitality is measured in other ways. Perhaps it's measured in the number of people who were affected by the ministry of this church over the course of the year: the people who were consoled during a funeral, or the people who were in a desperate place financially and turned to us for help, or the people who stopped and rested on our beautiful grounds and were strengthened for their journey. Or maybe, to really understand vitality, we'd have to look at the lives and actions of our members. How closely are we following Jesus and how is that reflected in our daily lives? This gets harder to measure, but perhaps brings us closer to figuring out what makes for a vital church.

I know that I feel vitality here at St. Alban's. I feel it whenever we meet together for worship, worship that is joyful and participatory, not perfect by any stretch, but eager to praise God. I feel it in our educational programs, in the holiness of helping each other delve deeper into the mystery of faith. I feel it in the exuberance of children who want to acolyte, who want to get closer and closer to the sacred. I feel it in the tenderness shown to those who are going through transitions, whether illness or the death of a loved one. We may be a small church, but I believe we are a healthy and vital church. We are vital as long as we are connected to the branch that is Jesus Christ, and as long as we continue to pursue his work of loving God and neighbor. I would love to know what you think makes St. Alban's vital and how we can continue our important ministry to our community.
