In the quiet of the guesthouse library at the Monastery of St. John the Evangelist, I picked up a copy of one of Mary Oliver's books of poetry. The first poem I read was entitled, *The Place I Want to Get Back To.* In the narrative, she vividly describes a woodland scene where, in the darkness before the first light, she sat still enough for deer to wander nearby. The end of the poem recalls her memory and longing for it to happen again:

I know I do not want to rush the process—I've spent far too much time rushing all my life. I am going to slow down and enjoy the holiness of each present moment that will take me into the future.

### "Nana You Need To Be Patient"

These words were uttered to me by my precious seven-year-old grandson, Peter, after giving him directions to put on his belt, put his dirty clothes in the hamper and come to me. He responded, "I can only do one thing at a time." How refreshing to know that Peter has been listening to me.

Listening is part of what I do as a deacon. For example, I received an application from a lady who needed assistance with her Entergy bill. I went to G&F Financial Services to pay the overdue bill but was denied *payment by check* (any check) due to her past history. Cash only accepted. I then mailed the payment to the Baton Rouge office but that didn't solve the problem. The lady in need called on June 9 to tell me her lights had been cut off. This began a series of 1-800 calls to talk to representatives who only referred me to their supervisors!

At one point, I was on hold for 39 minutes and finally the supervisor came on line and informed me that my check had not been received. He then repeated the "no check —cash only" policy. I persevered and did not hang up or use inappropriate language because I represented Jesus and St. Alban's Church. I explained that cash payment was not an option because church issued checks are needed for audit. After he reiterated the *check policy*, I asked for a call back from his supervisor. The "call back" came two weeks later, and this time I was placed on hold for 84 minutes with no resolution to the problem!

Finally I decided to dial 1-800 again. Yet another supervisor explained Entergy's position on the matter. My response was to explain the position of the Episcopal Church's Baptismal Covenant: "to respect the dignity of all persons and our charge as Christians to not let the hope of the needy go unheard and unmet." I emphasized that I could not embrace a policy that would leave a handicapped 58-year-old lady caring for her 90-year-old mother without electricity in the heat of summer. Still no response!

I then called the office of the Consumer Protection Division of the Attorney General's Office. They referred me to The Public Service Commission. Thanks be to God for allowing me to keep my patience and for reminding me that I am charged to comfort the afflicted and afflict the comfortable! Entergy finally listened but only because I was remembering Peter's words, "Nana, you need to be patient." A dose of persistence also helped. There is work to be done and believe me, I have only just begun.
