Forty-Day Farewell to Alleluía



On February 23, Farewell Sunday, the children's Sunday school class created individual signs focused on the joyful word, Alleluia, meaning Praise the Lord. Since the somber season of Lent—a time of prayer, self-examination, almsgiving and fasting—is in direct contrast to being joyful, Alleluia is omitted from the Liturgy until Easter.

To the delight of the congregation, the children came forward during the Eucharist to show their handmade signs highlighting the word *Alleluia*. Rev. Elisabeth suggested they hide their signs behind the altar—not to be seen again until Easter day.

The congregation was all smiles as they watched the children scrambling to hide their signs. What could be a happier way to celebrate the meaning of *Farewell Sunday* than to see the children participating in the Eucharist? It was a reminder to everyone that children are not just the church of tomorrow. They are precious members of the church today.

Elisabeth's Epistle



As we enter the season of Lent, you'll notice some changes in our worship. Less music and more space for silence. No flowers and a simpler altar. The reading of the ten commandments and our confession of sin at the beginning of the service. No "alleluia" in our music or prayer. These changes help to set apart these forty days as something distinct, a time of preparation, repentance, and reflection on Jesus' journey to the cross. Just as Jesus spent forty days in the wilderness, we are called to undertake our own disciplines during this season, whether that be fasting from something or the addition of a discipline such as prayer, daily Scripture reading, or giving of our time or treasure.

Lent is also traditionally a time of repentance, and in addition to our general confession of sin during the Eucharist, you may consider making a private confession. The Episcopal Church has a lovely stance on private confession, best summed up in the well-known aphorism: "All may, none must, some should." Although I grew up in the Episcopal church, I was in seminary before I felt comfortable enough to seek out what you'll see listed in the Book of Common Prayer as "The Reconciliation of a Penitent" (p. 447). What I discovered was a beautiful practice offered by our church that speaks to our need from time to time to confess a specific sin and hear words of absolution and forgiveness proclaimed to us personally. While our general confession assures us of God's forgiveness, some of us benefit from a one-to-one conversation and assurance of pardon. Confession is an absolutely confidential act, and typically anything discussed during the rite is never brought up again. If you think you may want to make a private confession, please let me know.

All of this focus during Lent on repentance is the spring housekeeping we do to tend to our souls in preparation for Easter. Just as our organ is getting cleaned and tuned this season in order to sing a new song during Easter, God is calling each of us to a season of preparation and realignment to be what God created each of us to be. May we use this time to the glory of God, that we may enter Easter with joyful hearts.
