

Dinner On The Grounds - Rooted in History

St. Alban's community is busy preparing to host one of the most popular events of the year—*Dinner on the Grounds*—an annual tradition deeply rooted in the past. Work is already in progress for the 2017 occasion to be held Sunday, October 29 immediately following the 11 o'clock Eucharist. Choir members and those serving in the Eucharist will exchange their vestments for black aprons sporting the church logo, "Come to the Country." The smell of smoked pork cooking on the grill will be wafting through the air and Ralph Miller, musician extraordinaire, will be strumming his guitar and singing.

The origin of the 158-year-old tradition of *Dinner on the Grounds* was discovered in the 1859 *Journal* of Wm Mercer Green, first bishop of Mississippi, who served the diocese from 1850–1887. The tradition of *Dinner on the Grounds* officially began May 5, 1859, when Bishop Green traveled to Bovina to consecrate St. Alban's, a new church in the diocese. He was delighted to find a large and energized congregation assembled for the important event. To his delight, he not only consecrated St. Alban's Church but also confirmed nineteen people during the service.

The bishop later wrote a lengthy entry in his *Journal* giving details of the consecration of St. Alban's. The entry ended with the mention of a 'meal' on the grounds: "At the close of the protracted services, a plentiful collation [light meal] was enjoyed under the beautiful and wide spreading beech trees adjoining the Church."


It was a glorious and historic day for the community of St. Alban's.



Early 1950s—Children and adults enjoying "Dinner on the Grounds" at St. Alban's




1950's photograph of *Dinner on the Grounds* captures adults enjoying lingering visit while the children engage in a game of croquette.

As the fall season approaches, St. Alban's is busy preparing for the annual *Ingathering Sunday*—a time when church member's pledge gifts of time, talent and treasure to be harvested for the glory of God.

Ingathering Sunday is held annually during the month of October when, in preparation for the coming year, church members sign pledge cards (gifts of treasure) and fill out time & talent sheets as a way of giving back to God. During the service, the gifts are placed in the offering plate as the congregation stands to sing the Doxology.

At St. Alban's, the harvesting of gifts for the 'less fortunate' continues year-round. Two ongoing missions are to supply food items for the *Salvation Army* and *Backpack for Kids*. Sadly, when school is not in session, approximately twenty students from the Dana Road Elementary School and Vicksburg Intermediate School have little or no food to eat during weekends and holidays. The weekly donations of ramen noodles, peanut butter crackers, macaroni and cheese cups, Jell-O, fruit bars and juice are used to fill their backpacks. On Fridays, grocery bags laden with food items are delivered to the schools where the children's backpacks are filled. Last week St. Alban's delivered fifteen bags. This is a weekly thing. Fill and refill! Feed the children!

The true spirit of giving at St. Alban's is exemplified by our abundant generosity and love for others. Your support helps not only the children but also the most vulnerable people with opportunities to lift themselves out of unimaginable hardships.

Often I am asked, "Why does St. Alban's do this?" My response is, "It is who we are. It is in our DNA." Thank you St. Alban's. You are a blessing to so many people—including my family.
