




A reception and book signing will follow the dedication.

Holy Order, Holy Chaos Children's Chapel

I taught first grade for a number of years and one thing I learned was that working with children is a combination of Holy Order and Holy Chaos. A classroom full of children working on a communal art project can quickly erupt into what appears to be chaos. Squeals of delight and spills of paint are part of the creative process with children. The secret is that without orderly preparation and planning, the creative process can





quickly turn into bedlam. Working with children requires a combination of Holy Order and Holy Chaos.

For the past two weeks Marci Turner has been busy creating Holy Order in the Children's Sunday School rooms. She has organized the arts and crafts materials, shelved books, set up the Children's Chapel altar area and prepared lesson plans. Marci is establishing Holy Order for our children's Sunday School program that begins on Sunday, September 21.

Marci has been prayerfully discerning how God is leading her to use her gifts. Like most discernment processes, God reveals a little at a time. God frequently puts signposts along the way to offer direction. In one way or another, Marci has been led to pursuing a ministry in Spiritual Formation and Christian Education. She instinctively sought out ways to respond to God in prayer and worship—singing in the choir, practicing centering prayer and enrolling in *Journey Partners*, a two year course for spiritual directors. Marci's desire is to share what she has learned by teaching in the Children's Chapel.



She is not alone when it comes to teaching the children. Jennifer Normand, Kerri Williams, Betty Rushing and Ann Tompkins are also committed teachers. Last Sunday was an example of Holy Order and Holy Chaos as Jennifer,

Betty, Kerri, and Ann led the

children in the messy process of making paint prints of their hands and feet. Without Holy Order, the paint could have covered far more than the surface of their hands and feet. Without the freedom of Holy Chaos, the process could have turned into a rigid exercise of exactness and precision. The teachers came



prepared with plans for Holy Order and the expectations of Holy Chaos. The result was a tablecloth randomly covered with prints of hands and feet.

Stop by the Children's Chapel and take a look at their children-sized altar and prayer space, their arts and crafts materials and the selection of children's books. Encourage our parents and grandparents to bring their children to be a part of our youth community—praise the children, and thank the teachers.
