On August 4th, the children and schoolteachers of St. Alban's gathered during the Eucharist to have their backpacks blessed as they begin the new school year. Rev. Elisabeth passed out *Blessed to be a Blessing* backpack tags to all who participated. During the Eucharist, the focus was on the meaning of the Blessing of the Backpacks and how the values instilled within the children will be carried out into the world to guide their lives.

So, what are the values? The answer is found in the Letter to the Colossians: "As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body... And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." Rev. Elisabeth passed out the gift tags while Rev. Brian Ponder blessed the backpacks. The presentation reminded everyone that we are all *Blessed to be a Blessing*.

E lisabeth's E pistle

We make a promise to each child baptized in the church that we will support them in their life in Christ, helping them by our prayers and witness to grow into the full stature of Christ. St. Alban's takes this commitment seriously. Within the next month, we should have new classroom space for our youngest members. We have also started talking about the goals of children's formation at the church. Among the goals we talked about at a recent meeting about children's and youth ministry included:

- Our children will know they are loved by God and by this church
- Our children will know the foundational stories of the Bible
- Our children will have a safe place to ask questions about faith
- Our children will be able to articulate their faith
- Our children will have opportunities to serve others

The work of children's formation is sacred work that involves all of us at St. Alban's. While in the long term, we want to explore children's Sunday school before the 11:00 a.m. service, for the present, our primary formational opportunities for children happen in the context of worship and fellowship. And what this means is that *every single member* of St. Alban's has the opportunity *every single Sunday* to be part of the faith formation of our young people. When one of our young people reads or acolytes during worship, take a moment to thank them for their contribution. If you see one of our younger children drawing a picture, ask them to tell you about what they're drawing. One of the biggest benefits of being in a church the size of St. Alban's is the opportunity our children have to interact with people of all ages. This is a gift.

As we discern how we can best nurture the youngest members of our church, you'll notice that we're going to be experimenting. For example, for the next few months, instead of having children's chapel, you'll notice that we're going to encourage all but our very youngest kids to be in worship. For children ages 6 and up, we'd like to provide more ways for them to experience the transformative power of our liturgy. We'll be providing books in the narthex and worship bags for kids to use in the pews to help them stay in church throughout the service. For our older youth, we're planning an acolyte training on September 29 to help them participate more fully in leading worship. We'll also have more opportunities for intergenerational fellowship. Every third Sunday, plan to stay after the 11:00 a.m. service for lunch and an intergenerational activity, where we'll work together across age groups on a craft, games, or service project. Praying and playing together will be the themes that carry us through the fall.

Our very youngest members of the body of Christ have much to learn, but also much to teach the rest of us. Let us pray for the wisdom to nurture their gifts for ministry that they may lead us closer to the kingdom of God.
