The Season of Creation is a time to renew our relationship with our Creator and all creation through celebration, conversion, and commitment together. During the Season of Creation, we join our sisters and brothers in the ecumenical family in prayer and action for our common home.

Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios I proclaimed 1 September as a day of prayer for creation for the Orthodox in 1989. In fact, the Orthodox church year starts on that day with a commemoration of how

God created the world. The World Council of Churches was instrumental in making the special time a season, extending the celebration from 1 September until 4 October.

Following the leadership of Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios I and the WCC, Christians worldwide have embraced the season as part of their annual calendar. Pope Francis made the Roman Catholic Church's warm welcoming of the season official in 2015.

In recent years, statements from religious leaders around the world have also encouraged the faithful to take time to care for creation during the month-long celebration.

The season starts 1 September, the Day of Prayer for Creation, and ends 4 October, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology beloved by many Christian denominations. Throughout the month-long celebration, the world's 2.2 billion Christians come together to care for our common home.


How will we honor the Season of Creation at St. Alban's?

all opinions are respected. We hope to see anyone who wishes to further their study of our walk with Jesus on Wednesdays.

### Elisabeth's Epistle

I have been thinking and praying a lot about the role of St. Alban's in our community and our mission as ambassadors of the kingdom of God. This past month has been one of those months when we didn't do a lot of big, flashy stuff, but that doesn't mean God wasn't at work. This was a month in which it seemed like God was working through our church in smaller ways to spread love and grace in the community. I began to realize that many of these small moments of grace are not visible to most people because they happen behind the scenes. And yet this is how Jesus has told us the kingdom of God will grow: from small things, like mustard seeds and yeast, and slowly, over time. But even though these moments are small, it is important to recognize and celebrate them. Here's where I saw the kingdom of God growing right in our very midst this past month:

- We have had many calls for help with electric bills since it has been such a hot summer. One week, we had calls from multiple members of the same extended family. Ann learned that this family had to bury a child this summer, and the funeral expenses cut into their household budgets. We were able to help several members of this family keep their electricity on, thanks to the donors who contribute to the Rector's Discretionary Fund.
- The storms this summer have also brought down a lot of trees and branches, particularly over at the rectory. We have had an incredible group of church volunteers cutting and chopping this wood, which will go to one of our Bovina neighbors who uses a wood-burning stove to help heat her house in the winter.
- One of our members heard about a teenage girl who was hoping to go to her school's homecoming dance, but did not have the money for a dress. Lo and behold, an envelope of cash appeared at the church, earmarked to help this teenager feel fully part of her school community and have something to celebrate in the midst of a difficult season for her family.
- Another evening, again quietly and without fanfare, a home cooked meal appeared at the church, lovingly provided for a family in need who is rarely able to eat home cooking.

As I was making this list, I realized that there are surely so many more moments of grace, glimpses into the kingdom of God, that I haven't heard about. This is our purpose as the gathered Christian community: to witness to the growth of the kingdom of God in all those small ways that are occurring all around us. I am eager to hear where you are witnessing the growth of the kingdom!
